Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas, Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington, until **11:00 A.M., on Tuesday, February 14, 2012**, and will then and there be publicly read for the construction of the improvement.

All bid proposals shall be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in cash, certified check, cashier's check, or surety bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of such bid proposal. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the specifications, the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the City of Camas.

Plans and specifications may be picked up at the Camas Municipal Center, Community Development Department, located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607. **Plans and Specifications will be available for pickup after 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday, January 31, 2012.** Plans and specifications may be purchased for \$35.00 plus 8.2% Sales Tax.

The improvement for which bids will be received follows:

Bid opening on Tuesday, February 14, 2012, at 11:00 A.M. at the Camas Municipal Building located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607. Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607, until 11 A.M.

Statement of Work:

This Contract provides for ADA curb ramp improvements within the Crown Park Neighborhood and surrounding neighborhoods of Camas, Washington. The work shall consist of saw cut and removal of existing cement concrete curb, sidewalk, asphalt pavement, and a catch basin. Work shall also include installation of new cement concrete curb, ADA compliant curb ramps, storm trench drain and catch basin, and other items according to the Plans and these Specifications.

Federal Funding:

This project is financed through the Community Development Block Grant Program with funds obtained from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The Contract is subject to regulations of the Departments of Labor, and Housing and Urban Development.

Attention is called to Federal provisions for equal employment opportunity, HUD Section 3 Requirements, and the minimum Davis-Bacon wages as set forth in the Contract Documents.

E-Verify Requirements:

Per City of Camas Ordinance No. 2626, as a condition for the award or renewal of any contract after January 1, 2012, the Contractor shall enroll in the E-Verify program through the United States Department of Homeland Security and thereafter shall provide the City with a copy of the Memorandum

of Understanding (issued by Homeland Security), submitted with their bid proposal, affirming their enrollment and participation in the program. The Contractor shall be required to continue their participation in the program throughout the course of their contract with the City. Prime contractors shall require and verify that each of their subcontractors and lower tiered subcontractors are also enrolled and participants in the E-Verify program. This is intended to be used exclusively for employees hired after award and for the duration of the contract with the City of Camas. E-Verify, is an Internet based system operated by the Department of Homeland Security in partnership with the Social Security Administration at no charge.
