This project includes construction of improvements to the City's existing decant facility at the City shops and a retrofit of an existing (not used) sludge lagoon at the City's Waste Water Treatment Facility. Work includes installation of new water lines for new yard hydrants, new streetlights, concrete / asphalt decant pad, oil / water separator and other incidental work.
