Subgrade for the project shall be defined as bottom of asphalt surfacing in the parking lot areas, bottom of concrete slab where scheduled for interior or exterior slab. Landscape and storm drainage features shall be generally shaped for drainage as indicated on the drawings. Excavation for building footings, and cleanup of grading disturbed during construction shall be the responsibility of the Bid Packet 2 contractor.

"00 73 13 SUPPLEMENTARY CONDITIONS 26.4.1 Pursuant to RCW 60.28, the Owner will reserve 5% Retainage from the moneys the Contractor earns on estimates during the progress of the Work, to be retained as a trust fund for the protection and payment of any person or persons, mechanic, subcontractor or material suppliers who performs any labor on the contract or the doing of said work, and all persons who supply such person or persons or Subcontractors with provisions and supplies for the carrying on of such work, and the state with respect to taxes which may be due from the Contractor."

2.1 D Clarify: Structural Fill may be granular pit run, select borrow material

1.4 A Revise: Paragraph to read:
The contractor shall familiarize themselves with the Geotechnical Engineering Evaluation included as part of this document in Section 00 31 00.

3.4 A 1 a Revise: Paragraph to read:
All foundations shall bear on compacted structural fill extending a minimum of 24 inches below all footings. Existing undocumented fill shall be removed within the perimeter of the foundation area of influence and re-placed as structural fill. Prepare soils in compliance with recommendations included in the geotechnical evaluation. Soils underlying the compacted imported structural fill base course shall be over-excavated an additional 12 inches, moisture conditioned to ± 2 percent of optimum, and re-compacted to 95 percent of the maximum dry density as determined by ASTM D1557. Furthermore, the compacted imported structural fill base course shall extend a minimum of 18 inches beyond the edge of footings laterally in all directions.

3.4 A 2 a Revise: Paragraph to read:
Under apparatus and structural slabs, the Contractor shall over-excavate, reinstall and re-compact soils prior to placement of the imported structural fill base course. Excavated native soils shall be thoroughly moisture conditioned to within 2 percent of optimum and placed in thin lifts not greater than 10 inches (loose) and compacted to at least 95 percent of the maximum dry density as determined by ASTM D1557.

3.4 A 4a Add the following: Where encountered, in areas scheduled to receive paving or exterior concrete slabs excavate and export undocumented fill to a minimum depth of 12" and fill with imported structural fill in compliance with paragraphs above before placing pavement ballast as defined in the civil drawings.

3.4 B Add the following paragraph:

1 PAYMENT for excavation and fill as defined heretofore, shall be at the unit price as may be accepted by the Owner at a price as established in the bid form for the quantities shown on the bid form. Variations on the quantities, more or less, than the quantities shown, measured as stipulated below, will be adjusted on a unit cost basis accordance with provisions under Changes in the Work in the Supplementary Conditions. Said price shall be incorporated into the Contract by means of duly executed Change Order.

EXCAVATE / EXPORT: The base bid amount shall include the excavation, haul off site and disposal of material determined by the owners designated representative, to be not suitable to use as a structural base for the building and / or surfacing as shown in the drawings and specifications. The cost to perform this work shall be calculated using the estimated quantity as provided on the BID FORM, and the unit price per cubic yard as proposed by the contractor and included in the Base Bid amount.

Quantities for export shall be measured as the hole remaining at the completion of excavation not including ramps and slopes created for the convenience of the contractor.

STRUCTURAL IMPORTED FILL: The base bid amount shall include the acquisition, haul, place and compaction of material determined to be suitable to use as a structural base for the building and / or surfacing as shown in the drawings and specifications. The cost to perform this work shall be calculated using the estimated quantity as provided in the BID FORM and the unit price per cubic yard as proposed by the contractor and included in the Base Bid above.

Quantities for imported fill shall be measured as material delivered to the site in the truck.

The contractor shall provide survey documentation sufficient to verify fill has been placed to the subgrade elevations for verification prior to application for payment.

 and wage rates that have been found to be prevailing for the
 cited type(s) of construction in the area covered by the wage
 determination. The classifications are listed in alphabetical

order of "identifiers" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than "SU" or "UAVG" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the "SU" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

On survey related matters, initial contact, including requests for summaries of surveys, should be with the Wage and Hour Regional Office for the area in which the survey was conducted because those Regional Offices have responsibility for the Davis-Bacon survey program. If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:

2.) If the answer to the question in 1.) is yes, then an interested party (those affected by the action) can request review and reconsideration from the Wage and Hour Administrator (See 29 CFR Part 1.8 and 29 CFR Part 7). Write to:

The request should be accompanied by a full statement of the interested party's position and by any information (wage payment data, project description, area practice material, etc.) that the requestor considers relevant to the issue.

3.) If the decision of the Administrator is not favorable, an interested party may appeal directly to the Administrative Review Board (formerly the Wage Appeals Board). Write to:

4.) All decisions by the Administrative Review Board are final.
