Purpose of the proposal and its anticipated effects, including any changes in existing rules: OMWBE proposes to amend WAC 326-20-048 to include LGBTQ individuals as presumptively socially disadvantaged. This will provide rule clarity and assure qualifications, procedures and guidelines for determining eligibility for the LGBTQ Certification is aligned with OMWBE's portfolio of programs insuring balance and equity. OMWBE proposes to adopt WAC 326-20-088 to implement the LGBTQ certification program in accordance with SB5950. Reasons supporting proposal: Current rules do not include LGBTQ individuals as part of the presumptive disadvantage group despite documented evidence of systemic discrimination and barriers faced by this community. This exclusion creates inequitable access to contracting and other revenue driven opportunities and perpetuates existing disparities. The proposed rule amendment seeks to address this inequity by: Recognizing the historical and ongoing discrimination faced by LGBTQ+ individuals
