1.	RFQQ 1906	Have you had a contractor before for this work? Is there an incumbent?	We previously had a contract in the 15-17 biennium doing similar but not the same work. There is not an incumbent.
2.	RFQQ 1906	Have the dates for the meetings been set?	The dates for 2020 have been set. They are January 29-30, July 21, October 13-14. Dates for 2021 have yet to be determined.
3.	RFQQ 1906	Primarily we would like to clarify part of the Scope of Work. Task 1 talks about up to 6 inperson meetings, but the list included in Task 1 only seems to point to 3 in-person meetings:	The task is to coordinate <u>up</u> to 6 meetings from 12/2019 through 6/30/2021. There are typically three meetings a year and the successful bidder would help plan and facilitate the following meetings: Jan 2020, July 2020, October 2020, Jan 2021, summer 2021 and perhaps one other meeting.

4.	RFQQ 1906	Are the in-person meetings all in the Puget Sound area?	No. The meetings are held in different locations around the state based on which lead entity is willing to host.

6.	RFQQ 1906	What type of Training are you looking for, something specific or based on needs that come up during the year?	The executive committee will determine the type of training that could be needed throughout the contract timeframe and will work with the contractor on delivery/content
