

## **INVITATION AND REQUEST FOR BIDS:**

Hensel Phelps is preparing a bid as a Prime Contractor for the **Concourse C New Power Center**, located at Concourse C of Seattle-Tacoma International Airport, 17801 International Boulevard, City of SeaTac, WA 98168.

Subcontractor, Supplier and Service Provider Bids are due no later than 12 PM Tuesday June 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020. Submit bids via email to PNWBids@henselphelps.com.

The Work includes converting existing locker rooms and a restroom into new mechanical and electrical space. Time limit for substantial completion of the overall project work is **730 calendar days**.

## Subcontractor / Supplier / Service Provider Work Scopes include:

Demolition, Abatement, Miscellaneous Steel, Waterproofing, Traffic Coatings, Flashing and Sheetmetal, Cementitious Fireproofing, Firestopping, Joint Sealers, Plaster, Steel Doors and Frames, Steel Rolling Doors, Door Hardware, Drywall Partitions, Acoustical Ceilings, Painting, Fire Extinguishers, Fire Suppression, Plumbing, HVAC, Electrical, and Communications.

This Contract requires work to be performed within an area of the Airport controlled for security reasons. All Contractor personnel working in restricted areas (including Airport Operations Areas (AOA), Secured, Security Identification Display Areas (SIDA) and Sterile areas) on this project shall have Port of Seattle airport-issued identification / access badges in accordance with Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 1540/1542 and the Airport Security Plan. Bidders should consider the impact of acquiring badges when preparing their bids. Reference specification section 01 14 13 – Airport Personnel Identification/Access Control and Security.

**Contracts** resulting from this invitation and bid will be executed on the forms of Hensel Phelps, copies of which are available for review by contacting Hensel Phelps. All costs associated with complying with these agreement forms shall be included in the bidder's proposal.

**Insurance** requirements to be included in bidder's proposal shall be the greater of the limits of coverage indicated in the Hensel Phelps contract forms, or, the levels stipulated in specification section 00 80 00 SC-11.04 – Contractor Liability Insurance. All costs for these insurance coverages and limits shall be included in the bidder's proposal.

Contracts in excess of \$50,000 will have a requirement to provide **performance and payment bonds** for subcontracted work and a **supply bond** for purchase agreements issued for furnishing of material. These bond forms are available for review by contacting Hensel Phelps. All costs associated with providing the bonds and providing the bonds on the Hensel Phelps bond forms shall be included in the bidder's proposal.
